To help promote rural development in Alberta, the Alberta Rural Development Network (ARDN) will donate **\$1,000 for a rural development project in a rural Alberta community**, selected by followers, once 500 users are following [@ARDNetwork](#) on Twitter.

How to Enter

1. Follow [@ARDNetwork](#) for news on post-secondary members, rural Alberta, research, events and much more.
2. Let us know through Twitter (either by direct message, mention, or by using the #Follow2Donate hashtag) which Alberta community you think deserves \$1,000 for a rural development project.
3. Head on over to ARDN's [Facebook page](#) to vote for who you think should receive the prize.

Rules

1. Once ARDNetwork gets 500 followers on Twitter, ARDN will donate \$1,000 for a rural development project in a rural Alberta community.
2. Tweeps can only suggest a community if they are following ARDNetwork.
3. **Voting will commence once ARDNetwork has 500 followers.** This will ensure that every nomination gets the same amount of time to acquire votes.
4. Once the winning community is selected, ARDN will work with them to determine how the \$1,000 will be used for rural development. For a community to be eligible to receive the donation, the community must:
 - a. be in Alberta
 - b. be considered a rural community (defined as having a population of less than 20,000)
 - c. benefit from receiving the donation
 - d. have a rural development project underway, be in the process of creating one, or be willing to work with ARDN to create a project
5. There is no set timeline for the contest, just as long as it takes to get to 500 followers.
6. Please do not create multiple profiles that follow ARDN.
7. Rules and terms may be subject to change without notice.
8. The winning community will be subject to a series of terms and guidelines regarding allocation of funds (to be provided at a later date).
